Introduction from our Chair of Trustees

Assalamu Alaykum wa Rahmatullahi Wa Barakatuh,

Alhamdulillah, Allah has blessed us with the auspicious month of Ramadhan. May Allah bless us all with his eternal blessings, forgiveness and acceptance in this great and blessed month, Aameen.

Alhamdulillaah since 1996, under the instruction and guidance of **Shaykh al-Hadith Hazrat Maulana Yusuf Motala (Rahmatullah Alayh)** the Azhar Academy has been striving to provide a high quality of Islamic and educational services as well as a range of other charitable activities. Our purpose is to continue his legacy and vision for the provision of our core services.

Alhamdulillah the past few years have seen the efforts of the staff and pupils at the Azhar Academy recognised, particularly with our **Ofsted Outstanding rating in March 2022** and the move into the Former Newham College F-Block taking place in March 2023. Having purchased the site in **September 2021 for £2.7million**, despite the guide price being in excess of £3.5million and the vendors receiving offers in this region, we were keen to move quickly to take advantage of the wonderful space. We completed the essential renovation and maintenance works to the value in excess of £1 million and just 18 months after completion, the AAGS operation transferred to the new building, with some work still currently ongoing. However, despite the significant increase in capacity, the Azhar Academy Girls School continues to have more applicants than spaces, as is highlighted below in the Report. The same is true for the Azhar Academy Primary School Alhamdulillah; it would be no exaggeration to say we could open a new primary school tomorrow and the capacity would be filled immediately.

With the work which has been undertaken to purchase and renovate the Tennyson Road site, the charity is currently significantly constrained in expanding its charitable growth and activities, due to the outstanding Qardah Hasanah debts. We are very much aware of the needs our community faces, including the desperate need for the provision of a Boys Secondary School, the expansion of our Primary School and Nursery, developing a community space at the Tennyson Road site and improving the playing facilities at our current primary school site, however, we simply cannot proceed with these activities until the financial burden on the charity is eased.

We are therefore in urgent and desperate need to raise **£1.7 million to allow us to repay the outstanding Qardah Hasanah** due which enabled us to purchase and renovate the Tennyson Road site. The Overview Report is intended to provide you, our supporters and community, a picture of what we at the Azhar Academy do, the range of services provided by the Trust and a vision for what projects we are seeking to embark on as soon as we possibly can.

In this blessed, most auspicious month of Ramadhan, I humbly request you to support us with this noble project in any way possible - financially, introducing us to friends/family/colleagues locally, nationally and internationally, who may be able to support us financially to pay-off our outstanding Qardah Hasanah, or professionally so that we may continue to expand in the provision of our purpose.

Proposed Future Projects

As we remain committed to serving the community and providing the necessary facilities to support you, we wanted to set out the key projects which we wish to undertake as soon as we are financially able to do so. Alhamdulillah over the past two decades, the

Azhar Academy has established itself as a pillar of the community, with our track record highlighted throughout this Report, including being freehold owners of 4 properties.

We humbly urge you to support us to embark on these noble, blessed and important projects, which ultimately culminate in protecting the Imaan and future of our children. Your support now will be a Sadaqah Jaariyah for you for the rest of time inshaAllah; for each child that learns, studies and serves the Ummah, you write yourself a portion of the reward, it is most definitely an open chequebook, particularly with the mercy of Allah. The projects we wish to undertake soon are:

- 1) Finding a suitable site for and opening a Boys Secondary School.
- 2) Conducting roof repairs on the Tennyson Road site which will be combined with the creation of a new floor and large school / community hall.
- 3) Building a new floor on top of the newly erected Hall building at the Primary School.
- 4) Creating better playing facilities at the Primary School site by installing Astro Turf in the playground and creating a new rooftop play area.
- 5) Opening another primary school.
- 6) Azhar Masjid Basement Hall
- 7) Romford Road School hall Dormar windows. (Listed buildings consent obtained).
- 8) 228a RR, rear yard single storey building. (Planning obtained)
- 9) Buy Shop/flat building next door to Primary school.

Looking towards the future, we have exciting projects in mind. We aim to construct a second-floor hall that incorporates a kitchen facility, ensuring our students receive nutritious school dinners. This expansion will also provide more space to accommodate exams, offer ample room for physical education activities, and serve as a flexible space for the benefit of our girls. Due to the high demand each year for spaces at the school, we intend to increase our capacity to 4 or even 5 form entry. Furthermore, we have plans to establish a Boys Secondary school. We are enthusiastic about these future endeavours and rely on the generous support and encouragement from our wonderful community to turn these ambitious projects into realities. We will be able to move forward with these plans which can only be considered once our Qardh hasana debt of just under $\pounds 2$ million is paid off. We appeal to everyone to kindly pray and generously support us financially to achieve our goals.

As we continue to strive for excellence in education and the holistic development of our students, we express our sincerest gratitude to the entire Azhar Academy community, parents, and dedicated stakeholders for their unwavering support. Girls School (AAGS)

- We purchased our first building in Forest Gate, London, in the Year 2000 235a Romford Road, London, E7 9HL.
- This building was a completely dilapidated church building and we applied for Planning Permission to build 3 floors into this building and operate a Girls secondary school with a capacity of 280 pupils.
- Alhamdulillaah, planning was granted in May 2002 and development work immediately began. We started the school in September 2003 with the aim of ensuring that girls are provided best quality education within a safe Islamic environment.
- Along with the full National Curriculum we also teach Aalimah (Traditional Arabic & Islamic theological studies, Hadith, Tafseer, Fiqh, Nahw/Sarf) which is accredited and accepted as an equivalent to a 2 years BA degree course.
- We also teach Hifz of Quran Shareef, an extremely popular option for a number of our students.
- On 20th March 2023, we successfully moved the AAGS from the Romford Road site and into the new building, enabling a capacity increase to 450 pupils.

Acquisition of New Building

Alhamdulillah, in August 2021, the Azhar Academy successfully acquired the former Newham College F-Block for £2.7million, a building of approximately 25000sq ft internally and approximately half an acre of adjacent land. Despite the Guide Price being £3.5million and the vendor receiving offers in that region, we were selected as the preferred buyers due to our excellent educational record.

Purchasing the site and completing the necessary works to ensure the site was able to obtain regulatory approval from Ofsted and the Department of Education was extensive, as has been listed below. The total costs were in excess of the value of £3.7 million, with works still ongoing Alhamdulillah. We completed all of the work which we have listed below, highlighting the extent of the work which was required to be completed.

- Apply for and get all new services, gas, electric and water into this building as all services had to be cut off when we purchased the site
- **02** Install a completely new hot water and heating plant to cover the entire building
- Installation of toilets to prepare the building to meet DFE standards. This building when purchased, only had 7 toilets and therefore we had to refurbish and install 26 toilets along with accessible toilets and shower facilities
- **04** Creating 2 further classrooms
- **05** Procure and install 2 fully resourced science labs and carry out all necessary preparatory works
- **06** Install a fully functional and proffessional resourced IT suite
- **07** Installing air conditioning units throughout the building
- **08** Entire building modernising of electrical work with certification and Replacing old lights with new LED lights;
- **09** Installing a kitchen
- **10** Preparing staff rooms and staff offices
- 11 Creating an assembly hall, as the building did not have one given it was part of a larger campus
- 12 Installing CCTV, fire, burglar and panic alarms
- **13** Installing new flooring throughout the entire building
- 14 Essential decorating, painting and furnishing works, including doors and windows, and replacing wherever necessary
- **15** Installing a PA system
- 16 Purchasing and installing smart screens in every class room, as well as in the assembly hall, which also contains a projector screen
- 17 Purchasing all necessary school furniture such as tables, chairs, lockers and the alike
- **18** Creating a car parking area for staff and play area for the children
- **19** Repairing and refurbishing existing windows to ensure consistency with the entire building
- **20** Repairing roof leakages and various other roof and gutter works

Material Change Inspection Report November 2022

Leaders have suitable health and safety policies in place. The proposed new premises are not yet in use, but leaders already conduct and record regular checks on the building to ensure its suitability.

Leaders have developed systems and procedures to assess and manage risk at the new site and these are appropriate. Leaders assess risks thoroughly and act promptly to mitigate these potential risks.

The proposed additional premises were previously part of a local college. The premises have subsequently been fully refurbished. The required safety checks, including those of fire alarms and emergency lighting are already in place. Leaders have effective systems to ensure that they monitor site safety, include fire safety. There are plans in place for regular fire drills once the proposed premises is open to pupils.

The premises was formerly part of the local college. This has been fully refurbished. This work is now complete and has been done to a high standard. The additional spaces and classrooms on offer at the new site are sufficient to accommodate the proposed increase in the number of pupils on roll.

The acoustics, lighting and toilet, washing and medical facilities in the new premises are all likely to be compliant with the requirements of the independent school standards. The washing facilities include safely regulated water supplies and suitable drinking water that is clearly labelled. Outdoor spaces are available for recreation and physical education, and these are also suitable for the proposed number of pupils.

Leaders have planned effectively in order to cater for pupils in the new building, and they ensure that the new premises are likely to be safe and suitable for the number of pupils the school intends to admit.

Leaders are aware of the needs of their pupils. They have created a culture of safeguarding in the school to keep pupils safe. Leaders have refurbished the new building with pupils' well-being in mind.



2023 GCSE Results

Alhamdulillah, through the mercy of Allah SWT, August 2023 marked an incredibly successful year for our GCSE results, despite National rates dropping significantly to below pre-pandemic levels. Our pupils and staff have worked incredibly hard to attain the best possible grades and to achieve the highest possible marks for the Girls, such that they are able to go on and pursue the A-Levels they choose to study, armed with the highest grades, skills and educational grounding to be able to thrive throughout their careers.

Some key stats are below:

The summer 2023 pass rate is 96% for students achieving at least five 5+ grades including Maths and English, with 93% of our students passing with 8 or more GCSEs Alhamdulillah.

- 95% of all grades were 4+ grades
- 52% of all grades were the highest prestigious 7-9 grades which is up from last year (51%)
- 93% of our students passed with 8 or more GCSEs
- 61% achieved a minimum of 4 7-9 grades which is up on last year (65%)
- At least 18/46 top students achieved at least 8 7-9 grades.
